
Nominations for the HBES Lifetime and Early Career Contribution Awards

THE HBES LIFETIME CAREER AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED SCIENTIFIC CONTRIBUTION is presented to candidates who have made distinguished theoretical or empirical contributions to basic research in evolution and human behavior. For this award, nominators should first submit only a name and a brief supporting statement to the committee chair. In the case of finalists, the committees may ask nominators for a longer statement and supporting documentation. The deadline for nomination: **March 31, 2010**. 
The HBES Early Career Award for Distinguished Scientific Contribution recognizes excellent young scientists who have made distinguished theoretical and/ or empirical contributions to the study of evolution and human behavior. For this award, nominators should submit a cover letter outlining the candidate's contributions, two or three representative publications, and an up-to-date c.v. The awards are subject to the following limitation: The nominee must be no more than 10 years post-Ph.D. Deadline for nomination: March 31, 2010. 




