## Nominations for the HBES Lifetime and Early Career Contribution Awards

**THE HBES LIFETIME CAREER AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED SCIENTIFIC CONTRIBUTION** is presented to candidates who have made distinguished theoretical or empirical contributions to basic research in evolution and human behavior. For this award, nominators should first submit only a name and a brief supporting statement to the committee chair. In the case of finalists, the committees may ask nominators for a longer statement and supporting documentation. The deadline for nomination: **March 31, 2010**. **THE HBES EARLY CAREER AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED SCIENTIFIC CONTRIBUTION** recognizes excellent young scientists who have made distinguished theoretical and/ or empirical contributions to the study of evolution and human behavior. For this award, nominators should submit a cover letter outlining the candidate's contributions, two or three representative publications, and an up-to-date c.v. The awards are subject to the following limitation: The nominee must be no more than 10 years post-Ph.D. Deadline for nomination: **March 31, 2010**.
